Weekly Council Update

- Varsity Basketball: The West Branch Cable Access Channel has begun to show the West Branch Boys Varsity basketball games as of Thursday, December 13th. Games will air Thursday, Friday, and Saturday evenings beginning at 6pm. The two most recent games provided to the city will be shown in chronological order.
- **Fitness Classes:** Kelly Sorgenfry is returning after the Holidays to offer Zumba on Monday evenings at Town Hall. Pilates with Angela Herren will move to Wednesday evenings. Robin Blackburn is no longer available to teach in West Branch due to other obligations. Parks and Recreation will continue to look for another fitness instructor to teach a conditioning class on Wednesday evenings. Registration forms will be available as soon as the Zumba time is confirmed for Monday nights.
- **Santa Storytime**: The West Branch Public Library will be hosting the annual Santa Storytime at 7:00 p.m. on the evening of Tuesday, December 18th. Santa will be making a special guest appearance, reading a story to the kids in attendance, and handing out candy canes. The program is generally one of the most anticipated and widely attended storytimes of the year and is always fun to attend for both kids and adults alike.
