#### Follow up / Reminder Items:

- Nuisance Abatement Conference in Iowa City May 15 will be facilitated by the League of Cities. This is a very sought after class, it was sold out last year, and we were unable to secure a spot. Although, it has not been open for reservations I have managed to secure five spots. Mayor, Mayor Pro Tem, Police Chief, Deputy City Clerk and City Administrator.
- I-80 Project We are working with IDOT to develop a utility agreement which is expected to
  layout the terms of reimbursement for the relocation of a water and force main that will
  need to be relocated due to the I-80 widening project.
- Residential Curb Side Yard Waste Collection (Starts Today through November) Collection takes place between the hours of 8:00 am and 2:00 pm each Monday. Keep in mind; holidays will delay the service by one day. Yard waste not placed on the curb by 8:00 am will not be collected until the following week. New for 2019... Residents utilizing this service must place yard waste in biodegradable paper bags only.
- Annual Cemetery Clean-up starts today through the 15<sup>th</sup> of this month. All items left on graves will be removed and discarded during the clean-up days. Visitors are encouraged to gather wanted items and remove them during this time should they be of sentimental value.

### **Events / Scheduled Meetings:**

 Hydrant Flushing – The public works department flushes fire hydrants annually each April to clean the City water supply system and to help the West Branch Water and Fire Department with determining if all hydrants ae working properly. This could contribute to discolored water coming from your faucet, if this occurs simply let the water run until clear. This make take a few minutes. • City-Wide Clean Up – The West Branch City-Wide Clean up days are held twice a year once on the 1<sup>st</sup> Saturday in May and the second on the 1<sup>st</sup> Saturday in October from 7:00 am to 11:00 am. The Clean Up is held at the Water Street Parking Lot, across from the Fire Station. Residents are encouraged to bring unwanted items to this location. There will be a \$10.00 charge for household appliances.
