ORDINANCE 804

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE "TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES" CHAPTER 65 "STOP OR YIELD REQUIRED".

WHEREAS, the West Branch City Council finds it in the best interest of the residents of West Branch to have a stop sign installed on Ridge View Dr. at its intersection with Prairie View Dr., in order to provide for the safety of the West Branch Community.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the City Council of the City of West Branch, Cedar County, Iowa:

Section 1: Amendment. The Code of Ordinances is hereby amended by the City Council of West Branch, Iowa by adding the following language to Title, "TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES", Chapter 65, "STOP OR YIELD REQUIRED", Section 65.02, STOP REQUIRED.

(Insert after current subsection)
Ridge View Drive at its intersection with Prairie View Drive.

Renumber all remaining subsections after these changes.

Section 2. Conflicts. All ordinances or parts of ordinances not specifically provided for and in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 3. Adjudication. If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged to be invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage, approval and publication as required by law.

Resolution 2023-79 – Authorizing and approving a certain Loan Agreement, providing for the issuance of \$3,040,000 General Obligation Corporate Purpose Bonds, Series 2023 and providing for the levy of taxes to pay the same. / Move to action.

Kofoed stated that the Roundabout project would be financed through TIF at about \$150,000 per year. The East Side Water Mains project would be financed through water fees and GF debt levy-about \$80,000 and \$75,000 per year respectively. Finally, the Wapsi Creek project would be financed from the GF debt levy and it would be about \$35,000 per year.

Motion by Dean, second by Miller to approve Resolution 2023-79. AYES: Miller, Sexton, Stoolman, Dean, Goodweiler. NAYS: None. Motion carried.

<u>Resolution 2023-80 – Approving and Accepting certain Municipal Improvements Constructed in The Meadows Subdivision Part 5, West Branch, Iowa. / Move to action.</u>

Motion by Miller, second by Dean to approve Resolution 2023-80. AYES: Miller, Sexton, Stoolman, Dean, Goodweiler. NAYS: None. Motion carried.

Resolution 2023-81 - Approve Pay Estimate Number 2 in the amount of \$211,598.68 to Lynch Excavating Inc. for the Eastside Water Main Replacement Project. /Move to action.

There were no comments.

Motion by Miller, second by Sexton to approve Resolution 2023-81. AYES: Miller, Sexton, Stoolman, Dean, Goodweiler. NAYS: None. Motion carried.

<u>Discussion – Water meter fixed base network</u>

Goodale would like Council to amend the FY24 budget to purchase the equipment, software, etc. for the water meter fixed base network. The network would allow the City Office to receive monthly meter readings, check on high or low use meters, and overall have a faster turn around for all meter related issues. Stoolman asked how long it currently takes to read the City's meters. Goodale responded that it takes about 1.5 days. Kofoed emphasized that this network would help residents by reducing liability, leaks would be detected more quickly, and it would also help take City employees less time to read meter and to do the billing. Sexton asked if the current meters could read to the hundreds of gallons. Goodale replied in the affirmative but stated that all the meters would have to be reprogrammed.

<u>Discussion – P&Z decision on the matter of closing a portion of the alley between N. 4th and N. 5th Streets

Stoolman stated that the City does not maintain alleys as well as it should. Three alleys are in bad shape.

Discussion from Council was about the costs of maintaining the alleys versus how many people benefit from</u>

Discussion from Council was about the costs of maintaining the alleys versus how many people benefit from the improvements especially in times of tight budgets. Olson recommended that the City could assess improvements on the relevant residents. Sexton asked if the residents that live around the alleys could create an association to help pay for the improvement of the alleys. Olson replied that it could be done but that all residents would have to agree to the association. Council decided that it would decide on a later date on what to do with the improvement of the alleys.

Discussion – Terror Trail alley

Resident Tigrett wants the City to better maintain Terror Trail alley because he has suffered damage to his property due to the lack of cutting shrubs and trees that are illegally located in the alley's right of way. It was also discussed that there is a neighbor that needs to clear plants and other items from the right of way. Goodweiler agreed that the first step should be to ask the neighbor to clean her property so the City will send out a nuisance letter. There are also questions about the ownership and parameters of the alley and surrounding properties but this is a separate issue that will be discussed at a later time.

<u>Discussion – Employee Benefits</u>

The Council continued a discussion about providing 100% employer paid health and dental insurance premiums for all employees. Kofoed stated that most cities that are the size of West Branch cover 90% or more of the employees' health premiums. Dean was concerned about raising taxes to accomplish this when the Council had already talked about raising taxes for other matters. Miller wanted to keep health stipends in lieu of covering 100% of the premiums. Overall, Council agreed that it would wait to decide and stated that this could be discussed again during the budget season.

Discussion – Post grade inspections on newly developed property within the city limits

Council discussed the possibility of post grade inspections as new homeowners struggle with drainage issues. Laughlin stated that this is not a good idea since it will cost the City more money and require more staff time. Sexton reminded Council that the City requires a site plan for new construction and that it does not make sense to require it if the City is not going to inspect the plan against the construction. Schechinger suggested that the City could hire an outfit to inspect the construction and pass the cost to the resident or that the City could require the developer to hire an outfit to inspect. Schechinger estimates that it would cost around \$250 for his company, V&K, to complete a post grade inspection.

CITY ADMINISTRATOR REPORT

Kofoed thanked the City staff who worked many hours to make Hoover Hometown Days a success. He also spoke about the importance of the Mayor, City Administrator, and Council uniting and communicating better with the public. With a difficult budget season coming up because of HF 718 passing, Kofoed wants Council to relay a clear message about the City's budget and finances. Sexton asked about having a work session to discuss how HF 718 and other state legislation decisions have impacted the City's finances so that he can knowledgeably discuss this with the residents. Kofoed stated that he has reached out to state legislators asking for feedback and confirmation of his projections but after many phone calls and emails, he has not heard back from anyone.

CITY ATTORNEY REPORT

Olson reported that we will need to convene a special meeting for next Monday to pass a resolution regarding the new language for the City's LOST election. In the resolution's new language for the election, LOST will begin July 1, 2025 instead of July 1, 2024.

CITY ENGINEER REPORT

Schechinger reported that the Roundabout project is delayed due to lights being shipped later than expected. He is still pushing for the project to be mostly completed before school starts. For the Meadows part 3 project, the contractors are working on sewer. The East Side Water Mains project is on track and the contractor is working on 6th and College Streets. Schechinger has also been working on the SRF loan requirements for the

second part of this project. Finally, the Wastewater Treatment project is progressing faster now that a new project manager has been hired to replace the one that left the company.

STAFF REPORTS - No report

COMMENTS FROM MAYOR AND COUNCIL MEMBERS

Mayor Laughlin thanked City employees for their work and contributions to the HHTD event. Stoolman had questions about a property on Green Street; the broken concrete by the water tower; and putting down tree sap in front of the sewer plant. Regarding the tree sap question, Goodale stated that he can get quotes for this if the Council is willing to amend the budget and add this expense to the FY24 budget.

BACKGROUND:

** Conditional approval is based on the Cedar-Johnson Rd / Herbert Hoover Highway round-about is open and the Dawson Drive detour has ended.**

September 4, 2023 - block party will be closing Dawson Drive from W. Orange Street to Prairie View Drive. (see attached map)

Staff is recommending approval with the following conditions:

- 1. Tents, tables and bouncy houses must be placed on private property.
- 2. Alcohol consumption cannot take place in the city right of way or upon city streets.
- 3. Amplified music must follow public peace ordinances and not played after 10:00 p.m.
- 4. Phone numbers of block party leaders must be posted on the barricades.
- 5. Emergency vehicle access must be maintained at all times.



BLOCK PARTY PERMIT APPLICATION

A block party is defined as an event open to a specific/defined neighborhood or area; where no admission fee is charged for attendance; where alcoholic beverages are not sold or where no entrance fee or admission is charged for service of alcoholic beverages; where a street closure, if necessary, shall not exceed six (6) hours; where the use of portable restroom facilities is not necessary.

Any and all requests for temporary street closings require approval by the West Branch City Council. BACKGROUND:

This ordinance passed its 1st and 2nd reading in 2021 and the 3rd reading was postponed for the improvement of the Main Street and Cedar/Johnson Road intersection, it was the consensus of the Council at the September 7, 2021 meeting to bring forward the 3rd reading upon project completion. The Herbert Hoover HWY roundabout is now nearing completion.

Repeal Chapter 63 (Speed Regulations) Section 04 (Special Speed Restrictions) Subsection 4B (Special 35 MPH Speed Zone) – Main Street from the west property line of 2nd Amended Plat Pedersen Valley Part Three to the Cedar/Johnson County line road.

The area described above can be defined as a "School District" under Iowa Code 321.1(70). School District-means the territory contiguous to and including a highway for a distance of two hundred feet in either direction from a schoolhouse in a city.

Our current City Code of Ordinances places a Special 20 MPH Speed zone in all School districts under 63.04(2)A. Therefore, a Special 25 MPH Speed Zone must be amended to allow for 25 MPH on W. Main St.

I recommend that Chapter 63.04(3)C be amended as follows:

63.04(3)C— Main Street from the east right-of-line of its intersection with Thomas Drive westerly to the corporate limit line.



RED—Existing Special 35 MPH Speed Zone BLUE—Existing Special 25 MPH Speed Zone YELLOW—New Special 25 MPH Speed Zone

Engineer may also direct contractor to install polymer grid under the macadam stone rather than under the modified subbase.

0022 Change: Since other storm sewer structures will be cast-in place, Contractor requested option to install manhole item as a SW-402 which provides for the manhole structure to also be cast in-place.

0030 Change: In areas where unsuitable/unstable material is encountered, Engineer may direct installation of Engineering Fabric under the polymer grid that is placed directly beneath the macadam stone.

8002 Change: After the project temporary traffic control and detour signing was in place, some improvements were identified that would likely benefit the traveling public. 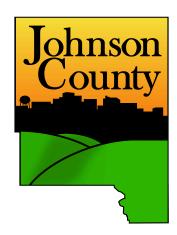

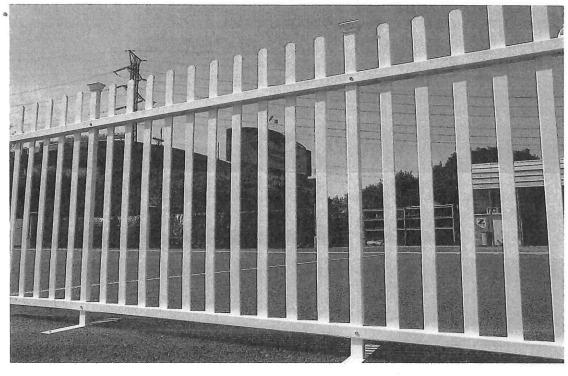

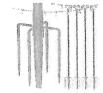

WHEREAS, City has agreed to grant the Business a Revocable License Agreement (See Exhibit A) to allow Business to use a portion of the Property for the establishment and maintenance of an outdoor seating area on the Property; and

WHEREAS, Jones must apply for the appropriate outdoor service privilege with the Iowa Alcohol Beverage Division as a contingency of this approval.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the West Branch, Iowa, that the City approves a License Agreement for Outdoor Seating for The Down Under, contingent upon obtaining the outdoor service privilege with the Iowa Alcohol Beverage Division.

LICENSE AGREEMENT FOR OUTDOOR SEATING

THIS LICENSE AGREEMENT (the "Agreement") entered into by and between the City of West Branch, Iowa, 110 N. Poplar Street, West Branch, Iowa 52358 (hereafter the "City"); and The Down Under, 102 W. Main Street, West Branch, Iowa 52358 (hereafter referred to as "Business").

WHEREAS, City is the owner of the property generally referred to as the "Heritage Square" located in the City south of Main Street (the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, Business owns a food and drink establishment generally known as the "Down Under," which is located adjacent to the Property at 102 W. Main Street in West Branch; and

WHEREAS, Business has approached the City about using a portion of the Property for the purpose of establishing an outdoor seating area on the Property; and

WHEREAS, City has agreed to grant the Business a Revocable License Agreement to allow Business to use a portion of the Property for the establishment and maintenance of an outdoor seating area on the Property, subject to the terms and conditions below.

- 1. <u>Grant of License.</u> City hereby grants to Business, a nonexclusive revocable license to allow for the establishment and maintenance of an outdoor seating area on a portion of the Property depicted on Exhibit "A" attached hereto. All costs associated with establishment and maintenance of the outdoor seating area shall be borne by the Business.
- 2. <u>Term of License</u>. This License Agreement will be remain in full force and effect as long until such time as the City gives the Business one hundred eighty (180) days written notice to the address listed below.
- 3. <u>City Use</u>. During the term of this Agreement, the Business shall have the right to use the Property for said outdoor seating area only in the area depicted on Exhibit "A." The City shall have the right to use the remaining portion of the Property in any manner it desires.
- 4. <u>Termination of License prior to expiration.</u> In the event that Business violates the terms of this License Agreement or ceases to operate as the "Down Under" in its current location, this License Agreement shall automatically terminate upon written notice to the Business.
- 5. <u>Effect of Termination</u>. Upon termination of this License Agreement pursuant to Section 2 or 4 above, the Business shall remove the outdoor seating area from the Property and

restore the Property to as close as possible to its original condition prior to the placement of the outdoor seating area on the Property.

- 6. <u>Indemnification.</u> Business shall save, defend and hold City harmless from any and all claims associated with the use of the Property under this Agreement.
- 7. <u>Insurance.</u> Business, prior to establishing the outdoor seating area on the Property, shall submit a certificate of insurance to the City naming the City as an additional insured on its commercial liability policy in an amount of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00). Said insurance policy shall contain a 30-day cancellation notice to the City.
- 8. <u>Applicable laws</u>. Business, in the establishment and operation of said outdoor seating area, shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws, regulations and ordinances regarding the serving of alcoholic beverages outside its establishment. All fees associated with said licenses shall be borne by the Business.

BACKGROUND:

The 2023 Iowa Legislature pass House File 718 better known as property tax reform. The bill is complex. City Administrator Kofoed will outline the major points, how it affects the city, council, and the public.

FINDINGS & DISCLAIMERS:

Kofoed projects, city council will need to cut its "general fund" services by 20-30% before 2032.

PRESENTATION GOALS

- 1. No, the City is not broke!
- 2. How can council help?
- 3. Roughly 20-30% reduction in general fund by 2032
- 4. Homework: Meditate
- 5. There is a way forward in how local governments can engage the public in a more effective manner

Talking Points

- 1. I'm incredibly sorry about Bill's condition, this is where I need your help. I'm worried that we may not have enough volunteers available if Bill has another heart attack. Each minute Bill waits for high performance CPR, his chance of surviving decreases by 10% EMS (story) Also btw, did you know in 2028 we will lose an addition \$40-\$50 k that supports our emergency services?
- 2. I'm so glad you're on our side. We need to support the Police Department. Did you know there have been preliminary discussions on eliminating the police department? Our revenue is restricted to 1.5% each year, that doesn't match police wages, it doesn't inflation. But now more than ever, you have the ability to help. (Repeat Library or Parks Example)
- 3. We cannot provide that level of service without a change in state legislation.
- 4. Developers: I'm sorry we can't provide that high of a rebate going forward. We are a moderately growing city and we have to reduce our revenue by 2%. Cities that aren't growing get to ask for more. You're a private business owner, you have more pull than me. We want your businesses here.
- 5. If a farmer buys more acres, would he/she not expect their expenses to increase too? Would it be okay for the state to say, since you are growing your business, we are going to deduct a portion of your increased income? That's what the state is doing to cities.
- 6. City staff is projecting council will need to cut 20-30% of the general fund budget by 2023.

Ask: What do we want to get out of this?

- 1. Tell state elected officials to make changes to the property tax reform bill.
- 2. Tell state elected officials to attend council meetings or meet with the Mayor and staff.

- 1. Dissolving the WBPD, for less coverage but have Cedar County take over?
