Reported to WBPD. According to city regulations, this dog is now classified as a level 3 offender (requires a sign to notify others of dangerous dog, adequate fencing, annual dog registration, and is required to be microchipped).

Officer Steen followed up with the dog owner and received some pushback on these requirements. The owner can appeal these requirements/classification, otherwise owner must ensure these requirements are met.

- There was another incident in August involving a dog biting a child. Child received some lacerations on their hand/arm. Dog was euthanized voluntarily by owner after this incident.
- There was also an incident on Scott Drive with a weed control person and a dog, but no additional information was provided.
